Preminational Contested Identifies an Acad Practices of Resource Speaking jewish Migrants in local and Sermen

FOOD FOR THOUGHT



How do immigrants from the former Soviet-Union construct their identities through their food practices once they arrive in Israel or Germany? Dr. Julia Bernstein, former Bucerius scholarship recipient offers an answer to this question in her PhD thesis that was published recently: Food for Thought: Transnational Contested Identities and Food Practices of Russian-Speaking Jewish Immigrants to Israel and Germany. Dr. Bernstein is one of the protagonists in the documentary Mazel Tov that portrays Jewish immigrants from the former Soviet Union in Germany. The Bucerius Institute is introducing Dr. Bernstein's work in combination with the screening of the documentary on December 14 at 18:00 in the Keller House in Haifa.



Dr. Tamar Cohn-Gazit, former Bucerius scholarship recipient was one of the lecturers at the Symposium "Marking, Deportation, Extermination-Seventy Years to the Deportation of German Jewry" held at the Leo Baeck institute in Jerusalem on November 3. Dr. Cohn-Gazit spoke on the testimony of Willy Cohen about his first deportation from Breslau.







With the beginning of the new academic year, the Bucerius Institute has launched an internship program. Since October, the Bucerius staff receives support from two interns from Germany, Jana Michaelis and Regina Schulz, who will work for the Institute until the end of the semester. The program also introduces the participants to the academic life at the University of Haifa, as it includes Ulpan classes at the International School.





In 2007, Prof. Manfred Lahnstein, Chairman of the **ZEIT-Foundation established the Manfred** Lahnstein Scholarship at the Bucerius Institute. The PhD scholarships are awarded to young researchers from various disciplines that join the Bucerius Institute for one academic year. Since 2008, ten young scholars carried out their research in Israel. The Bucerius Institute congratulates Dr. Sebastian Peter Korinth who is the first Lahnstein scholarship recipient to complete his work on his dissertation with the title "Silent Reading Speed: Individual Differences and Training: Brain Activity, Behavior and Eye-Movement Measures".



More than 3000 friends of Israel gathered for the Second German-Israeli Congress held on October 23, 2011 in Frankfurt. The event took place under the auspices of the President of the Central Council of Jews in Germany, Dr. Dieter Graumann: the Israeli Ambassador in Germany. Yoram Ben-Zeev and Ms. Regine Sixt, from the Sixt-AG. Dr. Graumann called upon the importance to be solidly united with the Jewish State: "Israel is still struggling for its existence. Iran stands behind the terror of Hamas and Hezbollah. That is why business with the regime is unconscionable and must stop" he demanded.
