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Biography:

Born and bred in Paris in a post-68 Jewish family, I have learned and worked in many academic institutions in different countries: France, Germany, Israel, Spain, Portugal, Italy and USA. My first specialization was modern German philosophy (from Kant to Heidegger) and its French interpretation by philosophers like Levinas and Derrida (my beloved professor). This specialization has never ceased to be the intellectual background of my interrogations and I am active as a researcher and translator in the field of German speaking thinkers – focusing mainly on the Jewish German tradition and its broader political and theological meaning as well as on the question of translation. I have published and written several articles on these questions. During my Ph.D. studies (1998-2004), I studied the relationship of Jewish thinkers to Renaissance Humanism – focusing on the work of Don Isaac Abravanel (1437-1508). After completing my dissertation, I wrote three books and many articles on diverse aspects of Jewish thought and literature in the Renaissance. My biography of Isaac Abravanel was recently published in the prestigious series *The great men of the Jewish people* of Salman Shazar and was accepted to be translated and published in *The Tauber Institute Series For Study of European Jewry* (Brandeis University Press).
